HARRY T. & HARRIETTE V. MOORE MEMORIAL HOMESITE

This property is the former homesite of civil rights activists Harry T. and Harriette V. Moore. two people whose lives were committed to help Florida's Negro communities unite to form a property teentify. Mr. Moore was a Brevard County educator for demanding equal period was a Brevard County educator for demanding equal period to equalize the salaries received by Negro teachars with worked to equalize the salaries the organized the Progressive Vokas of the white counterparts. He organized the Progressive Vokas of Negro Negro and new political opportunities for minority clitizenss pic ided new political opportunities for minority clitizens of the state. Mr. Moore organized the first Brevard County Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in 1934, and served as its president of the Florida State Conference of the Branches of the NAACP, and then as the executive director until his death. Mr. Moore and his wife were murdered when a bomb was planted beneath their house on Christmas night in 1931.
